

Table 1 shows the number of schools in Palau by school type and school level. There are twenty-six schools altogether. Of the total schools, nineteen are public schools while the remaining seven are private schools. The public schools include eighteen elementary schools and one high school, while private schools include two elementary schools and five high schools.

Table 2 shows a total enrollment of 2,890 students of public and private elementary schools. Of the total elementary enrollment, 79.2% are enrolled in public schools. Looking at enrollment by schools, Koror has the highest enrollment of 653 students, followed by George B. Harris at 554, and Maris Stella at 319. Schools with the lowest enrollment include Pulo Ana, Sonsorol with 6 students and JFK with 17.

Table 3 shows a total enrollment of 1,218 for both public and private high schools by grade levels in school year 2004-2005. Of the total high school enrollment, 65.4% are enrolled in public schools. Looking at enrollment by schools, PHS has the highest enrollment of 797 students, followed by Mindszenty at 201. Schools with the lowest enrollment include BMS at 27 and Emmaus at 27.

Of the total enrollment of 4,108 students, public schools has higher enrollment of 75.1% compared to 24.9% for private schools. By school level enrollment, 70.4% were enrolled in the elementary schools while the remaining 29.6% were enrolled in the secondary schools.

Enrollment by grade level shows elementary schools enrollment range between 322 and 434 with grade 6 having the highest and grade 3 having the lowest. The enrollment in the high school level indicate a steady decrease as students progress through the grade levels beginning with grade 9 having the highest enrollment of 394 students and ending with grade 12 having the least enrollment of approximately 60% of grade 9 enrollment.





As shown in Figure 2, one in every three students is enrolled in the private elementary schools. A higher proportion of students are enrolled in public elementary schools due to enrollment in private schools being limited only to those who can afford tuition and other school fees.



As shown in Figure 3, about two thirds of high school students are enrolled in public schools. Tuition and other school fees required in private schools limit enrollment to those who can afford such costs.




Figure 4 shows the distribution of student enrollment by region. Central region, being the most populated, has the largest number of students 3,097. Babeldaob region has 27.2% of students. Outlying states have the least number of students, all in public schools.

Note: The **M/F Ratio column**, states that for every 100 female there are *x* number of males in each given grade level.

In the public schools, as shown in table 7 above, the male/female ratio in the elementary level (grades 1-8) indicate more male than female students, with grade 1 having the highest ratio of 135 and grade 4 having the lowest of 104. At the high school level (grades 9-12), grades 9 and 10 shows more male students then female but as they progress to higher grades (11 and 12) female outnumber male students. Data may indicate that more male students in the public schools are leaving high school early. For the private high schools (grades 9-12), as shown in table 8, there are also more female than male students.

Table 9 shows drop out students by grade level in both public and private schools. When comparing public and private schools, there is considerably more drop out students in public schools than private schools. As a percentage of the total student enrollment, drop out rate amounts to 2.8 percent for SY 04-05. By grade levels, the top 3 grades with highest drop out rates were grades 1, 2 and 9.

As shown in Table 10, more males than females are dropping out of school. Incidences increase more in the high school when comparing elementary and high school levels. Of the 52 drop out students, 59.6% of them are high schools students while the remaining 40.4% are elementary schools students.

As shown in Table 11, more students in public schools withdraw from school compared to private schools. As a percentage of the total student enrollment, student withdrawals amount to 1.5%. When comparing grade level withdrawal rates for private schools, grade 10 has the highest rate of 6.9%, followed by grade 1 with 4.7%. For public schools, grade 9 has the highest of 4.7% followed by grade 10 with 3.3%.


Withdrawal refers to any student who leaves school and stays out of school for the rest of each given school year after a parent/guardian submit official withdrawal request.

As shown in Table 12, more males than females withdraw from school. When comparing grade levels, withdrawal occurs more in grades 1 and 6 for elementary and grades 9 and 10 for high school.

As indicated in Table 13, there are more students repeating grades in public schools than those in private schools. In the elementary, grade 1 had the highest number of repeaters, closely followed by grade 6. In the high school level, grade 9 has the highest number of repeaters, followed by grade 10. As a percentage of the total student enrollment, student repeaters amount to 4.4%.



As shown in Table 15, public schools experience more transfer student than private schools. It appears that students who transfer into schools are more than those who transfer out. This could mean additional students transferring into the school system from foreign schools. When comparing grade levels, the highest number of student transfer occurs in grade 9, followed by grade 1 and 3.



The large difference between **Transfers In** and **Transfers Out** could be a result of students transferring in from outside of Palau's school system.
