Who needs **Civil Registration and** Vital Statistics?



Need information to determine infrastructure and services' requirements.

Governments Require both types

of information and cause of death information to inform sectoral policy and budget priorities.

robust civil registration system is the most reliable, cost-effective and timely source of vital statistics. While Estimates of fertility and mortality serve an important function, they are not a substitute for real data. There is a real risk that policy decisions based on incorrect estimates could lead to poorer health

Pacific Countries and Territories are making significant progress in improving CRVS systems under the Pacific Vital Statistics Action Plan, 2011-2014.

The plan was developed by the Brisbane Accord Group (BAG), a consortium of development partners, with the aim of:

- improving vital statistics in the Pacific region, and
- improving coordination between development partners.
