O.I.E./F.A.O.* Regional Conference on Epizootics in Asia, the Far East and Oceania.

Dr P.R. Harvey, Chief Veterinary Officer (Services) Department of Agriculture, Stock and Fisheries, Territory of Papua and New Guinea, attended the above-named Regional Conference held at Canberra, Australia, from 20-24 October 1969 as a delegate from Australia. Dr Harvey also acted as S.P.C. representative at the Conference, and his report to the Commission is circulated herewith.

Delegates from sixteen countries, including Fiji, New Caledonia and Papua and New Guinea attended the Conference.

Of interest to territories is the presence of Foot and Mouth disease epizootic in pigs in Vietnam. In territories where there are commercial aircraft connections with Vietnam, this may have special quarantine implications, and quarantine officers should be made aware of the situation.

In the report mention is made of Surra and Haemorrhagic septicaemia in Indonesia, and that notes on the clinical symptoms of these diseases will be submitted to officers on the border districts of Papua/New Guinea with West Irian. Because the remaining South Pacific territories are geographically isolated, it is far easier to control movement of animals and animal products and minimise disease introductions. Dr Harvey is of the opinion that concern over the spread of Surra and Haemorrhagic septicaemia to other parts of the Pacific is not warranted. These diseases are not zoonoses and man does not, therefore, play a part in direct transmission. In the case of Surra, it can only be introduced by infected and carrier animals and insect vectors, and in Haemorrhagic Septicaemia by carrier animals.

The Conference expressed concern on the introduction of exotic diseases through illegally imported animal products or ships' garbage, and the resultant feeding of this material to animals. The attendant risks involved with grabage feeding cannot be minimised, and territories should also be aware of the difficulties in enforcing controlling regulations. Aircraft garbage is of no less importance, especially with the larger aircraft, and the steadily increasing number of commercial flights to all territories.

In its recommendations, the Conference emphasised the precautions to be taken in the importation of animals with respect to Foot and Mouth disease, Brucellosis and Contagious Bovine Pleuroneumonia. With the last named it is to be noted that only two properties in Australia are regarded as infected, and no cases of Pleuropneumonia had been reported in the current year. Many territories of the Region import cattle from Australia, and should therefore note the recommendation, 'that imported live cattle ought to be negative to two complement fixation tests for contagious Bovine Pleuropneumonia not less than 25 nor more than 30 days apart while in isolation in the exporting country, and that they be purchased from an area that is free of the disease.'

In the event of an outbreak or suspected presence of Foot and Mouth Disease in a Territory, every effort should be made to establish an early diagnosis and determine the type of strain(s) responsible for the disease. This can be done through the Indian Veterinary Research Institute Makteswar, India; the Razi Institute, Teheran, Iran; the F.M.D. Institute, Nang Sara, Thailand, or the FMD World Reference Laboratory, Pirbright, United Kingdom. Territories are expected to adhere to the strict precautions as recommended by the Pirbright Laboratory for the shipment of samples. The Commission will attempt to secure a copy of the precautionary recommendations for circulation to the Territories.
