#### VANUATU STRATEGIC ROADMAP FOR EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

The PIEMA project conducted the Vanuatu Strategic Roadmap for Emergency Management (SREM) consultation workshop in Port Vila on 12 – 14 November 2019.

The workshop included representatives from the National Disaster Management Office, Vanuatu Police Force, Police Maritime Wing, Vanuatu Fire Service, Vanuatu Police Training College, Office of the Government Chief Information Officer, Department of Strategic Policy Planning and Aid Coordination, Education Cluster Lead and ACT Fire and Rescue.

A similar consultation process was held in Tonga for their SREM on 16 – 18 October 2019. Follow up visits to both countries, including Solomon Islands, are planned for first quarter of 2020 to finalise their respective SREMs and pave the way for their endorsement by relevant government authorities.

The Project represented the PIEMA members at the Forum Officials Committee (FOC) Sub-Committee on Regional Security (FSRS) meeting (14-18 Oct) held at the Pacific Islands Forum Secretariat (PIFS) in Suva.

The intention of the Regional Roadmap is to guide the development of a comprehensive regional coordination mechanism over a 2-3year period, and be inclusive of training, legislative, capacity and other issues needed to be addressed for the coordination mechanism to be effective.

In November, the PIEMA project supported the Kiribati Government to implement an activity under their SREM to further strengthen the Kiribati Police Service (KPS) Fire Service through basic firefighter training provided by their twinning partners, the South Australia Country Fire Service (SACFS).

This assistance from SPC included the provision of two additional fire trucks through the Building Safety and Resilience in the Pacific (BSRP) project. As part of ensuring the sustainability of these assets, the SACFS and included a mechanic in their training group to work with presentations on the Pacific Fusion Centre KPS mechanics on basic maintenance skills required for the trucks and their water pumps.

The FSRS meeting witnessed the official launch. The training was supported by the Office of Te Beretitenti (President), Disaster Risk Management Office and Kiribati Police Service.

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To support fulfilment of these Boe Declaration As part of the sustanable capacity development model commitments under Strategic Focus Area 2: activity, the Project conducted PacIMS<sup>1</sup> and WEOC<sup>2</sup> Human Security and Humanitarian Assistance, courses in Nadi (2-6 Dec) with support and local trainers SPC through the PIEMA project will work with from Fiji Airports, NDMO and Police. Similar courses were conducted in Port Vila (10-13 Dec) with support and local trainers from the Vanuatu Police Training College
