Key Issues/Challenges: Staff Shortage

Only one dedicated senior staff – teaching sta "borrowed" from other programs

Reliance on international recruitment

Teaching intensive workload – staff unable to perform well in other duties (research)

Poor retention

Key Issues/Challenges:

Lack of Research and Postgraduate Studies

Lack of PG studies undermines attractiveness of OS program for top performing students

imited capacity to develop PG study curriculum

ack of research relevant to OS implies that

Staff involvement in OS program is unattractive

No internal capacity building for junior staff

Potential for feeding research findings back into the data production cycle remains unfulfilled
