Partner Dialogue Guidance Note

Introduction

A partner dialogue will be held as part of the 5th Pacific Regional Energy and Transport Ministerial Meeting in Vanuatu.

The partner dialogue will be held from 3.00-4.30pm on Wednesday 11th May immediately after the closed Ministerial Dialogue.

This is a space to provide updates to Ministers from the Pacific on key work your organisation and/or country are progressing in energy and maritime transport sectors across the region.

Partner time allocation

A maximum of 3 minutes will be provided to partners who have been allocated a speaking space in the dialogue. The use of a slide deck is not required.

It is requested that partners keep to the strict timeframe so Ministers can ask follow-up questions and have a genuine discussion with partners, donors, and stakeholders in progressing genuine and meaningful actions to progress the region's energy and transport sectors.

Topic for discussion

- What is your strategic vision or commitment to accelerate the decarbonisation of the Blue Pacific over the next 5 years?
- What is your organisation's strategy to mobilise the financial resources required for such a decarbonisation to occur?
- How does your organisation plan to work with development partners, international financial institutions, and relevant stakeholders in the Pacific region to access climate finance and achieve the goal of carbon neutrality by 2050?
- What innovative solutions and technologies is your organization developing or implementing in the Pacific region to achieve sustainable energy and maritime transport systems?

Due to limited space in the agenda, interventions have been limited to one per organisation and based on requests by partners, countries and stakeholders.

Once final partner allocations are completed the time of your specific intervention will be provided closer to the Ministerial Meeting itself.
