Improving the use of export trade pathways for agricultural products

Description: Increasing the participation in, benefits from and sustainability of the export of agricultural products is a priority for all Pacific Island Countries. Export access exists for many products but the use of these pathways and benefits from them are often low. Extensive information exists on the agricultural sectors in the region, accessible export markets, trade flows, compliance with biosecurity and other regulatory and commercial requirements, and market demands but it is often difficult to access or understand, and not fully utilised to inform decision making. As part of the Enhanced Pacific Market Access Partnership (EPMAP), the New Zealand Ministry for Primary Industries (MPI) is working with partner countries towards addressing this. A project is underway with the Pacific Horticultural and Agricultural Market Access Program (PHAMA Plus) to identify market characteristics, utilisation levels, constraints and opportunities that seek to unlock trade potential.

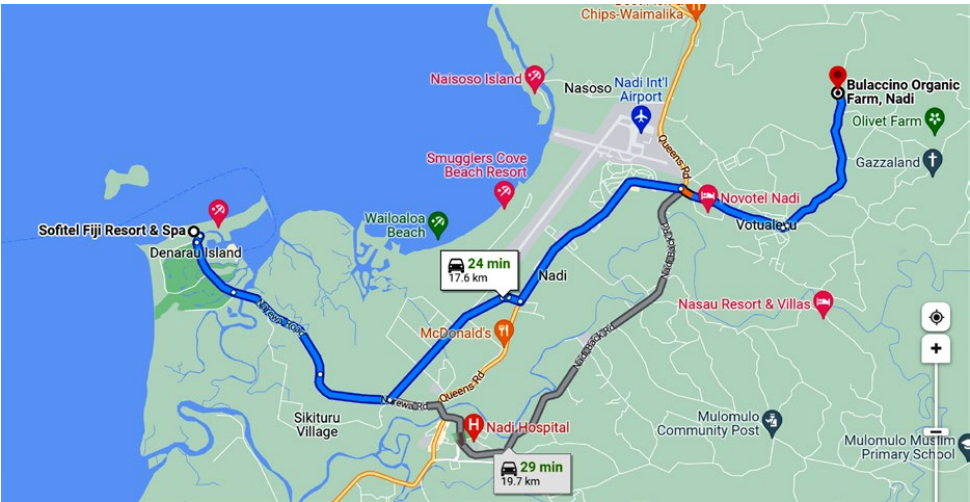

Developing Tailored Agro-met Predictions for Target Cropping Systems in Vanuatu: tailOred System of Climate services for AgRiculutre (OSCAR)

Description: In this side event, a presentation, we will introduce the APEC Climate Center (APCC) portion of the Van-CISRDP; Vanuatu Klaemet Infomesen Blong Redy, Adapt mo Protekt (Van-KIRAP) project including experimental field trials for major staple crops, various training and education programs in both on-line and on-site, and the development of the OSCAR system incorporating various Artificial Intelligence techniques and modelling approaches. These will provide relevant climate information applied to the agriculture sector. The CCD will serve as a tool to collect data in an efficient streamlined manner from different areas of Vanuatu. Utilizing the data from CCD, OSCAR will be a hub for the interaction of climate information and agriculture.

This side event includes a discussion led by Pacific Environment Programme (SPREP) to explore opportunities to establish User Interface Platforms (UIPs), which allow communities of practice, such as the agriculture sector, to engage in more focused discussions on information gaps and needs of the sector, and how the climate community can address them better. SPREP, through the Pacific Meteorological Council, has established a Pacific Regional Climate Change Centre, which is a consortium of organisations in the Pacific, dedicated to providing climate information and services to the region. The UIP is a concept which enables more interaction between the communities of practice, with support to develop targeted products and services such as the CDD and OSCAR. This initiative is supported by the European Union-funded, Intra-African, Caribbean and Pacific Climate Information Services and Related Applications (Intra-ACP ClimSA) Programme.

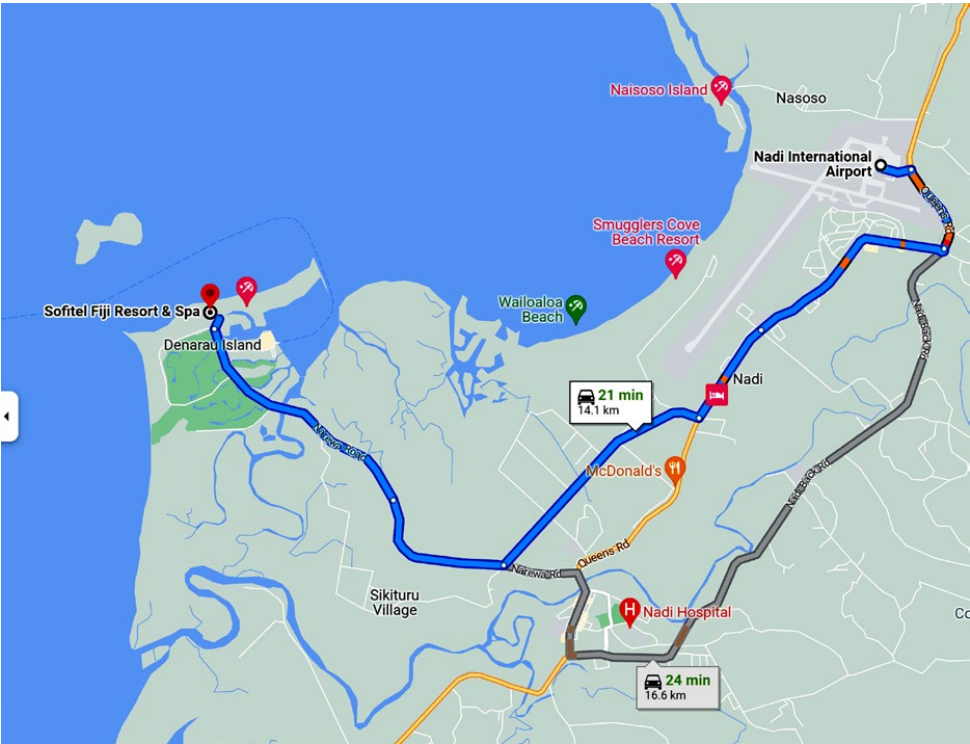

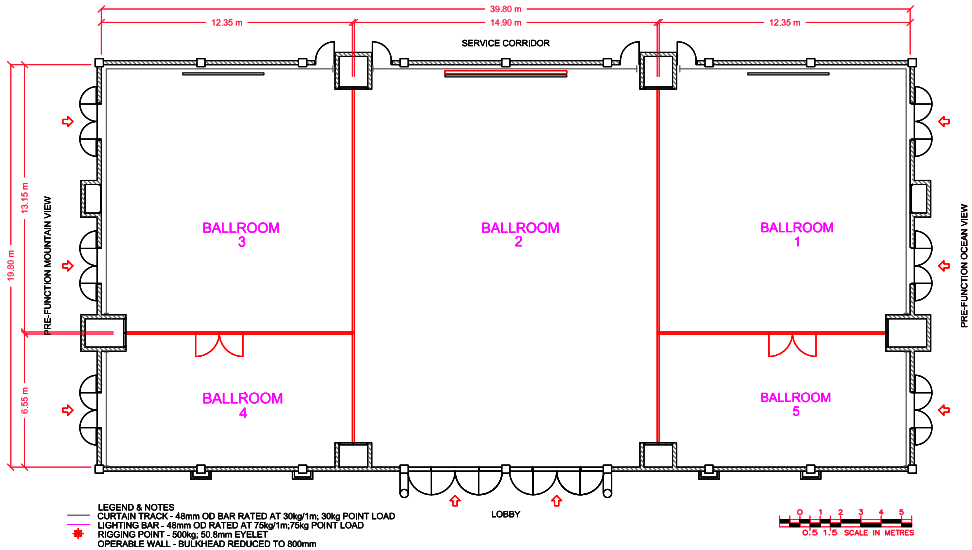
Direction map from the Nadi Airport to Sofitel Fiji Resort, Denarau Island.
