# BACKGROUND

Land degradation undermines the integrity, stability and services of ecosystems. Countries that are party to the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification have an obligation to prepare National Action Plans to implement the provisions of the Convention. In support of this, SPREP, in collaboration with UNDP, is about to execute a regional GEF-funded Sustainable Land Management Project (SLM Project). This meeting follows the completion and submission by PICs of the national-level proposals to the GEF for inclusion in the project. Broadly speaking the meeting was intended to begin to prepare PICs to execute their projects. (It was confirmed in the meeting that 12 of the 14 PICs had achieved GEF Secretariat approval to proceed whereas two only are needed to make minor revisions.) The following SOPAC staff attended the meeting:

- Netatua Pelesikoti attended to raise the awareness of the SLM workshop participants and resource people of the DRM national action plan development process and its linkages to national actions on UNCCD and SLM.
   Paula Holland attended as the SOPAC representative on the CROP Land Resources Working Group (LRWG). The LRWG met several times during the meeting to prepare for and coordinate backstopping requirements for the SLM Project.
- James Dalton attended to coordinate activities between the SLM country projects and the GEF Integrated Water Resource Management (IWRM) Project currently under design.

## **Objective and Workshop Outcomes**

The stated objective in the workshop was to prepare countries for the implementation of the GEF-SLM medium-sized project. The expected outcomes were to:

- identify and prepare for the challenges that will be faced during the implementation of the project.
- identify ways to progress and complete the national action plans.

- raise awareness on how a Medium-Term Investment Plan and Resource Mobilisation Strategy could be developed.
- familiarise with the use of the Environmental Economics Tool Kit.
- identify an approach for developing a Sub-Regional Action Plan (SRAP) and potential themes.
- identify support roles for the members of the Land Resources Working Groups.

Details of participants at the meeting are given in Annex 1. The provisional timetable for the workshop is provided at Annex 2. Details of the SPREP-executed SLM Project are available on the SPREP website and the UNDP Global Support Unit (GSU) web site. A CD of presentations and documents presented at the meeting is available from the Secretariat on request.

## Issues raised

There is considerable complementarity between some of the national work proposed under the SLM Project and various existing projects already underway within SOPAC, particularly:

- the IWRM project under design;
- the EU water project;
- the HYCOS Project;
- the Water Demand Management Project;
- Disaster Risk Reduction and Disaster Management national action plan development process; and
- the EDF 8 and 9 KRA 3 on implementing comprehensive hazard and risk management tools.

James Dalton gave a short presentation on the projects underway highlighting possible links with the SLM country projects. Netatua Pelesikoti gave a presentation on the DRM Regional Framework and the current process of developing DRM national action plans. Countries were invited to identify outcomes, outputs and activities that are common with their projects to ensure alignment of activities and to achieve more efficient use of resources.

There is also complementarity between work planned under the SPREP SLM Project and the expertise/services more generally available from SOPAC (eg., the use of GIS for land planning, planning to execute NAPs economic skills etc.). To identify backstopping needs and coordinate CROP agency responses, the CROP Land Resources Working Group met several times during the meeting. Separate minutes of those meetings are currently being finalised by SPC and will be distributed to LRWG members soon. Paula will distribute these to SOPAC staff then. However, key issues are that:

- The LRWG is to agree a strategy to determine how to allocate backstopping activities across CROP agencies in relation to comparative advantage and availability. Once a strategy is agreed, a document to describe this strategy is be prepared and circulated for consideration.
- A matrix of support needs for countries participating in the SLM Project was prepared (eg., training in GIS, help with project reporting etc.). Each agency in the LRWG ticked where they had comparative advantage. A combined matrix will eventually be passed to the SLM countries in order to identify places to ask for help. Paula will distribute this to programme managers for their input. (done)
- Neta, shared with the LRWG the Partners' Capability matrix prepared by CRP on behalf of the Disaster Risk Management Partnership Network. A similar matrix could be prepared for the LRWG members in consultation with other CROP agencies on the services that CROP agencies can provide to PICs in doing work generally. The matrix, once finalised, would probably be useful for all countries and CROP agencies to use when preparing and coordinating activities.

 Neta will join Paula in representing SOPAC on the LRWG to ensure that all sustainability issues for SOPAC are covered.

A request was made during the meeting for training both in the use of economics to analyse and or address SLM problems and in the use of the project cycle to manage in-country activities. Discussions on conducting training in both of these areas has already been held in relation to the SOPAC IWRM project. It appears that UNDP provides project cycle and project management training so SOPAC may be able to tap into this for the IWRM Project. The IWRM Project could perhaps collaborate with the SLM Project in resource economics training, if suitable. However, with the proposed closure of the UNDP Global Support Unit (GSU) in March 2008, countries will have less regional support for project activities. One way to support them could be through links to the IWRM Project – especially where demonstration project sites and activities overlap. At the national level, the EU IWRM Planning Programme may be able to provide some assistance, from an IWRM perspective, in supporting the development of Sustainable Land Use practices as part of the wider IWRM planning processes. Follow-up links have been made with the SLM contact points, copied to the IWRM Project Focal Points. SLM Project representatives will be invited to the IWRM 3<sup>rd</sup> Steering Committee meeting to be held in Suva, 5-8<sup>th</sup> November.

Niue shared some experiences from the inception of its SLM project (e.g. challenges included the lack of continuity between staff designing projects and staff executing them etc.) that may be useful when considering the IWRM Project.

A highly technical presentation was given by the UNDP Global Support Unit (GSU) on the use of economics to support SLM. The presentation was not pitched at a level that was understandable or relevant to most countries. There was consequently a request from the floor for examples of where economic tools had relevance to PICs. Paula provided to SPREP a digital copy of last year's STAR paper on economic tools for natural resource management so that it can be included on the workshop CD.

Andrea Volentras (UNDP Samoa) gave a presentation on GEF funding issues of the future. The presentation was a bit confusing so we may have missed some of this. However, Andrea did encourage countries to build into their SLM projects activities in preparation for GEF5.

Hans Eschweiler stated that the GEF is apparently developing guidelines for investment plans for GEF projects (related to SLM) as well as guidelines for SLM generally. We should get a hold of these for future projects.

## Sub-regional/Regional Action Programme

On the last day of the workshop, the opportunity to develop a sub-regional/regional action programme (SRAP) under the umbrella of the UNCCD was discussed. A representative of the UNCCD Asia Regional Coordination Unit presented on provisions of the Convention that call for the development of SRAP to support the implementation of the UNCCD and to support national implementation of the convention.

He pointed out that several SRAP had been developed for the Asia, Middle East and African continents. The objective for a sub-regional and or regional programme is to prepare and implement sub-regional or joint action programmes, as appropriate, in order to complement and increase effectiveness in the implementation of national action programmes.

The workshop participants recommended that the Land Resources Working Group in consultation with the UNCCD Secretariat and the Pacific countries is to consider appropriate approaches to develop a sub-regional or regional action programme.
