EXPLOSIVES

Not only kill targeted fish, but also kill juveniles, non-target species and the corals where fish live

Particularly devastating to fish that sleep amongst corals and in shallow areas

Underwater breathing apparatus (UBA)

In many places, entire reefs have been stripped of lobsters and sea cucumbers taken from deeper water by UBA divers. Banning UBA protects stocks in deeper areas.
