REPORT

During the SOPAC 29th Annual Session, held in Tarawa, Kiribati from 26 September to 4 October 2000, Joseph Cain, the delegate from the Republic of Nauru, requested a visit by an Information Technology Unit staff member to address relevant work program tasks that include:

The visit was made to Nauru immediately after the annual session and was for 2 weeks duration. During this period an activity log was maintained and included as Attachment A and meetings were held with staff from government and other organisations in Nauru where these are included as Attachment B.

The relevant issues are:

PROPOSALS

Four proposals with covering letters were produced where these can be submitted individually or collectively by Nauru to a suitable donor. The 4 proposals are classified as Restricted as they include methodologies and costs that would be valuable to other consulting organisations.

LAN/WAN PROPOSAL

The LAN/WAN proposal was formulated after discussion with the Secretary to Government, Acting Secretary to Government, Department of Industry and Economic Development staff and Cenpac (the ISP) staff.

This is basically a 6-phase project with a total budget of AUD 250,000 and provides a networked information system for government offices with a dedicated connection to the ISP.

REGISTRY UPGRADE PROPOSAL

This proposal was formulated following request for assistance by the Registrar and several visits to the Office of Births, Deaths and Marriages, located in the Secretary to Government office. The Registrar received a single desktop computer running Linux with copy of LifeData that is a proprietary format Registry database developed by the state of Victoria.

The system was setup by an Australian company and no training or documentation -was provided in operations. The system currently cannot print the required forms and additional hardware plus programming is needed followed by a visit by the Registrar for operations and maintenance training.

The estimated budget is AUD 20,000.

ISP UPGRADE PROPOSAL

This proposal was formulated following request for assistance by the ISP engineer and several visits to ISP, located in the Telecommunications building. The system requires an upgrade in hardware and software

The estimated budget is USD 20,000.

GIS AND REMOTE SENSING WORKSHOP PROPOSAL

This proposal was formulated following request for assistance by Nauru Fisheries and Marine Resources Corporation. There is an AGSO proposal that basically does the same but costs AUD 150,000 and leaves Nauru with ArcInfo that is not economically sustainable.

The estimated budget for the SOPAC solution is AUD 40,000.

OTHER MATTERS

RON BROWN DATA

Obtained copy of Ron Brown bathymetry data from Joseph Cain on CD. The files are in GMT format from a Unix machine and can readily be converted in SOPAC into AutoCAD or MapInfo format.

VISAS

Visitors to Nauru require a visa where it is understood that this costs some AUD 400 and has apparently resulted from an increase in businesses being operated by non Nauruans, in particular Chinese nationals. Whether these non Nauruans have purchased Nauruan passports is a matter of conjecture but SOPAC staff need to be aware that a visa is needed before travelling to Nauru. The simple solution would be to request the National Representative to fax a request for a visit and then to present this request together with the passport(s) of relevant staff to the Nauru consul in Suva for the necessary visa. My passport was provided to Nauru immigration and a 12 month visa provided at no cost.

TRANSPORT

Transport is essential and it is recommended that the National Representative be requested to arrange such transport at no cost to SOPAC before any visit is made.

COMMUNICATIONS

Communications are inadequate where the Menen hotel has only one outside line, the general telecommunications infrastructure is generally unreliable and currently there is no international link. There is one ISP that provides dial-up for approximately under 100 users but with inadequate infrastructure, dial-up can only operate from the government offices that are fortunately adjacent to the exchange and international link.
