INTRODUCTION

- Project scoping proposal drafted in February 2015
- Project proposal requested by Cook Islands (EMCI) and former Director Charles Carlson in June 2016 for preparation of building plans/design to develop the standalone National Emergency Operations Centre.
- First concept design developed in 2016, Consultations held with stakeholders completed
- Land identified in Nikao however, Land and technical issues forced a review of plans
- Negotiations with SPC and Cook Islands government were stalled in 2016
- 2021 Director John Strickland appointed and reviewed the project
- November 2021 SPC/BSRP II and Cook Islands government came to agreement to continue project
- 2022 Funding availability confirmed by SPC/BSRP II. CI Government agreed to terms for contribution
- 2023 NEOC Concept design reviewed and provided for further consultation
- 2023 NEOC Project steering committee established
- March 2024 MOU signed between SPC/BSRP II and Cook Islands Government
- To date: Concept Design being re-evaluated

IMPORTANCE & RELEVANCE


The NEOC would be the central hub for all national disaster emergency operations. The proposed NEOC will also be the training centre for all DRM related programs and workshops. The NEOC would augment the operation of EMCI in achieving its goals and objectives as required under the DRM Act 2007 and Goal 13 of Governments National Sustainable Development Plan (NSDP) 2016-20 'Strengthen resilience to combat the impacts of climate change and natural Disasters'. The NEOC would provide a central hub to manage and operate responses to national emergencies and all hazards. This will be the first of its kind in the Cook Islands.




2016 DESIGN CONSIDERATIONS



First Concept design 2016




2016 top floor design




2016 Bottom floor design





DESIGN CONSIDERATIONS

- Building code reviewed under BSRP project in 2018 which includes disability access etc.
- Existing DRM Act 2007 is now being reviewed to promote inclusiveness in gender equality and disabilities plus governance amendments
- Concept design must meet these requirements as well as being fit for purpose
- Current design also meets high profile national security measures
- Multi-purpose design

CONSTRUCTION PHASE

- Site/location to be confirmed
- · Cook Islands Investment Corporation (CIIC) manages the project on behalf of OPM/EMCI
- Geotech tests
- Environment Impact Assessment (EIA) process (3 month process)
- Building Permits
- Ministry of Health review for waste etc.
- Tender process to confirm contractor
- MOU between contractor and Cook Islands Investment Corporation (CIIC)
- Procurement and logistics for materials etc.
- Building and utilities commence
- Final Inspection and sign off
